
As always, we on the Finance Committee are always open to discussions and/or suggestions on phone, email or in person.

In 1957, Doug Ford predicted that he'd win The Masters with a score of 283. Amazingly, not only won the tournament he got the score he predicted too




And one for those who get a little frustrated on the course:

Business house has been running for many years and started with just 2 teams: Target Panelbeaters and Hibiscus Travel. Do you recognise anybody?




